



Policing Budget for 2022/2023

As Police and Crime Commissioner I set the budget for local policing. This includes the police precept level - the part of your council tax that goes towards policing.

I am very mindful of the wider financial pressures we are all facing, and the need to secure an efficient and



effective police service ensuring future sustainability. These have been paramount in my considerations.

New investment will unfortunately be limited in 2022/23 due to inflation, unforeseen pressures and service demands faced. I have therefore taken the decision which was supported unanimously by the Police and Crime Panel to raise the police precept by 5.3%. This means a monthly increase of £1.22 and an annual precept of £290.16 for a Band D property. This raises a total precept of £66.760m and provides a total central core grant and local funding of £127.445m.

This level of funding will enable Dyfed-Powys Police to continue to safeguard our local communities and to focus on the delivery of my new Police and Crime Plan.
