As a consequence and the fact that identical separate requests were forwarded to both Authorities the below response represents a total response concerning both Authorities

I can confirm that Dyfed-Powys Police and the OPCC does hold the information requested the details of which are as follows:

- (a) The number of desktops in the total IT estate is 1025
- (b) The number of laptops in the total IT estate is 400
- (c) The number of servers in the total IT estate is 294 (80 physical, 214 virtual)
- (d) The current provider of IT disposal is Stone Computers
- (e) The re-seller which provides IT hardware varies 3 quotes requested on purchase from suppliers (up to £25,000)
- (f) Dyfed-Powys Police/OPCC is not tied into a time bound contract with our incumbent IT disposal company. We are waiting for the National Procurement Service to provide framework for us to utilise.
- (q) The current contract is on a rolling basis.
