Request

We are currently working on a research project related to the Community Remedy (Part 6 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act, 2014) and would like to submit the following freedom of information request in three parts. We are conscious of issues around the costs to your organisation of gathering and supplying information to researchers, and so we would appreciate it if you could still provide us with information in relation to Q1 as a priority, and latterly then with information in relation to Q2 and Q3, costs permitting:

1. What work is the Office for the PCC undertaking to monitor the implementation and uptake of the Community Remedy?
2. Are there currently any plans to revise your Community Remedy document?
3. How have you publicised the Community Remedy to the general public?

Response 1:

I can confirm that the Police and Crime Commissioner does hold the information requested, as detailed below:

The usage of Adult Community Resolutions (ACRs) has been raised by the PCC at the Policing Accountability Board (a quarterly meeting within which the Chief Constable is held to account by the PCC). A briefing paper was submitted regarding the volumes of ACRs and the results and recommendations from a dip sample audit of their use.
