Heddlu Dyfed Powys Police

Heddlu Dyfed Powys Police proxy measures are reported on the below (unless otherwise stated) for the most recent 12 months (October 2022 - September 2023 with the exception of 13th - 14th May 2023 due to a change in force systems). The time period for the baseline* data set is July 2018 - June 2019.

Opinion Research Services (ORS) are an independent social research company and Market Research Society (MRS) Company Partner working on behalf of Dyfed Powys Police to conduct Victim Satisfaction Surveys. The above results are for the first 5 months of surveying conducted by ORS. 62.4% (107) victims of crime and 71.9% (115) victims of ASB were satisfied or very satisfied overall during this first 5 months of surveying. The surveys were conducted with victims who reported to Heddlu Dyfed Powys Police between 1st January 2023 and 31st May 2023.

Focus on communications regarding Domestic Abuse

From November 2023 real-life stories and useful and clear messaging in relation to Domestic Abuse will be communicated on social media. This will include ensuring awareness around the rights to access information if you are worried for about your situation or someone you care about.

Cardigan drug runners jailed for 8.5 years

Two men who made 10 drugs runs from Cardigan to Newport in two months have been jailed for a total of eight-and-a-half years. The total street value of the drugs they had hidden was £5,100 across 11 packages. The officer in the case said: "Thanks to the relentless work of our officers, this source of heroin has now been stopped, and we hope this sends a message to other drug dealers that we're tracking their movements and we'll stop them too."

Parents jailed over death of teenage daughter.

The parents of a teenage girl who died in "abhorrent conditions" in her bedroom have been jailed for a total of 13 years and 6 months.

Following the report of her death, an intensive police investigation was carried out, with engagement from the Crown Prosecution Service, as well as medical, dental and environmental experts.

Her parents were charged with gross negligence manslaughter after it was established that physical and hygienic needs had not been met.
